The concert will take place on Saturday, May 11, 2024, at 7 PM at the Clemens Center Powers Theater in Elmira, NY.

As a part of the education infusion initiative, the OSFL will hold two events for the general public to "Meet the Soloists." On Thursday, May 9 at 1:00 PM, the consummate crossover pianist, Bryan Pezzone will give an engaging presentation about his diverse career path including his Hollywood gigs recording major films (Disney movies, Warner Brothers cartoons, AAA games, *Harry Potter, Frozen, Star Wars* and hundreds more). At the piano, Pezzone will demonstrate his fusion of jazz, classical, modern and more, including improvisation across genres. This event is hosted at Corning Painted Post High School. In addition, a vocal master class will be led by Fredrick Redd on Friday, May 10 at 4:00-5:30 at North Presbyterian Church at 921 College Ave., Elmira. The 1959 movie starring Sidney Poitier aptly demonstrates the brilliance of Gershwin's skill combining musical theater, jazz, and opera in what is considered the first great American opera to hit Broadway.
